BROTHER DEDICATED TO CONTINUING ALPHA GAMMA RHO TRADITION AT PENN STATE

Why I Gave—**Bill Nichol '50 (Γ603)**



In 1950 **Bill Nichol '50 (Γ603)** arrived on the Penn State campus, nervous and excited to begin his time at the University. He was relieved when Alpha Gamma Rho chose him and 15 other men for the 1950 pledge class. “We would do almost anything to be able to stay at the beautiful Alpha Gamma Rho chapter house,” Bill remembers.

Grateful for his experience at Gamma Chapter, Bill says, “It was fun to learn something very worthwhile outside of the classroom.” His fond memories are what prompted Bill to donate to the campaign for Gamma Chapter. “There are too many young men graduating with agricultural degrees from Penn State without the understanding of brotherhood. We can do something about this situation. Now is the time to act.”

Bill believes that in order to compete with apartment complexes at Penn State, the chapter house must be remodeled. He is proud of the funds Gamma Chapter has raised and is confident it will draw in future members. “Let’s become involved now to move AGP ahead, to make sure the students at Penn State will have the opportunity we had to become brothers.”

Since graduating in 1952, Bill has devoted his career to agriculture. In 1959 he joined Pennsylvania Holstein Association as executive director. He retired from this position in 1997 and received the lifetime title of executive director emeritus. In addition to his work-related responsibilities, Bill served numerous professional organizations and has been recognized for his dedicated service to the agriculture industry throughout the years.

Why I Gave—**Rick Carpenter '59 (Γ774)**

Rick Carpenter '59 (Γ774) thinks of Alpha Gamma Rho as a win-win-win situation. He says it is this attitude that compelled him to contribute to the capital campaign. “I have a debt to the fraternity and the chapter, as do all brothers with this wonderful experience that carries on throughout life.”

The third win for Rick was his post-graduate experience. “Some people find it hard to grasp the network of brothers after college, but it’s absolutely incredible. For those of us involved in phases of agriculture, there are brothers to support us in nearly every intersection of life.” From mentors to bosses, Alpha Gamma Rhos have been alongside Rick for much of his life. “I literally have friends that are AGP brothers in more than 20 states and that network has been absolutely

After retiring in 1990, Rick and his wife, Carol, opened Red Bud Cove B&B, a bed and breakfast in Branson, Missouri. Rick is a past president of the Alpha Gamma Rho Educational Foundation and a past grand president of the Fraternity.
